Don't forget to turn your clocks ahead one hour on Sunday, March 13th.



I have a rather short list when it comes to the number of things I truly despise. Daylight Savings Time features very prominently on that list. The unlimited hubris humans possess to believe we can fiddle around with time is astounding. Some of you may be thinking "slow down Marc, time is a human construct" and I would agree with you partially. The uniformity we seek through human constructed time zones is meant to enable better communications and facilitate commerce. Yet even time zones lack immunity from our hubris. A great example is China which spans five geographic time zones while only recognizing one time zone for the entire nation. It should be noted though that regardless of what time we may say it is, the processes of nature are never bound by our clocks. We are powerless to hasten the sun's rise or delay its setting. One farmer put it succinctly during a Congressional debate on Daylight Savings Time when he stated that the dew would evaporate on Standard Time whether we are on Savings Time or not. Clearly then, nature operates on an unchanging rhythm to which we would do well to align ourselves.

Why am I choosing to speak to this you may be wondering with more urgent matters facing the world? The simple answer is that our playing God with time is not limited to the time to which we set our clocks. We are continuously trying to turn back time to a supposed easier sphere of life or we are trying to push time ahead with the ease of simply resetting a clock. By doing so we fall prey to the same problems which perpetuate Daylight Savings Time. The argument is often made that Savings Time is necessary to conserve energy and lessen traffic fatalities, yet studies consistently show this is not the case. How can these fallacies continue to be maintained in light of such evidence? Our answer is found in the basis for why we still refer to the "good old days" that were neither good nor easy. They were filled with as much suffering and affliction as now; we simply choose to ignore them as we do the science against Daylight Savings Time. We prefer to fiddle with our memories as much as we do time.

Likewise, studies continuously show the physical, mental, and emotional toil that jumping back and forth in time each Spring and Fall cause us. Our body clocks simply cannot handle such desynchronization. If our emotional well being is so tied to these clocks, imagine the toil we are imposing when we are always seeking and failing to advance the clock ahead so that we may escape trouble, hard work, and difficulties. We all desire for things in life to improve over night, but our failure to mark time to the rhythm that God has set will only leave us frustrated and angry. It is particularly true when it comes to church culture and church growth. Yet, if we choose to leave time to the Ancient of Days and allow ourselves to be continuously in the present, we will find the sweet nectar of God's grace abounding in and through us. Let us resolve to do just that and find ourselves made whole, leading lives of abundance as we seek to irradicate spiritual Daylight Savings Time from our lives. And if you choose to write legislators to legally repeal Daylight Savings Time, I would be eternally grateful.


### **New Staff Member**
