The middle is something I have been giving a lot of thought to lately in part because it seems to be popping up all around me. I am solidly in the middle of my fifth decade, and hopefully that means I am at mid-life. I'm entering my 21st year of ministry which probably constitutes my being mid-career. Finally, we all find ourselves in the year of our Lord 2024, which places us in the middle of the decade. I suspect all of us find ourselves in the middle in some part of our life even when we fail to recognize our location, the question is what are we doing with the opportunity the middle offers?

It occurs to me as I have pondered "the middle" that one of the great gifts of this position is the knowledge that the end has not been written yet. Now, I know you are thinking oh yes it has, God knows it, and you and I would be in agreement. I would point out though we do not have the mind of God and so we remain in the dark concerning the future. We do not have to face it resignedly, but can make decisions now to change the story we have been living. We may not know what plot twists are upcoming, but we can say this is where I want to go and more importantly, where I think God desires for me to go and make the appropriate changes now, in the middle. Beloved, we should not rush to write the end of our story when we still have multiple chapters still to encounter. Our world is filled with too much resignation and despair, changes need to occur and our examination of the middle may be the catalyst needed to bring light and hope.

When I think of this more broadly, I see that Grove Park's story has not been completed yet either and we all have a role to play in writing the next chapters. So, as we enter the middle 20's, what do you want Grove Park to look like at the dawn of the 2030's? Have you taken the necessary step to inviting one of your Five, a person who could play a pivotal role in Grove Park's next chapter? Have you committed to being Kingdom driven by engaging our world through one of our four redemptive justice ministries? Are you asking God what are the words and sentences that will make the stories which compose our next chapters and imploring for grace to be able to discern them? Last month, with so many sermons and papers and articles to write all I wanted to do was never write again as the fatigue seemed insurmountable. You may have the same feelings concerning the chapters still to be written in your life and personal ministry. I can give witness to the fact that I made it through thanks to the power of prayer and God's abundant grace and you can too! So, pick up your pen and together let's start writing the next chapter.

We may not be able to predict what will happen in 2024, or even to foretell what specific things God has in store for us during this year. But, there is one thing we can predict about God. As Jesus promised in the Great Commission, He is with us always - every day - no matter what comes. He will be with us every day of 2024 and every day beyond that, until the end of the age. And because He never changes (Malachi 3:6), we can count on His power, His understanding, His grace, and His love to surround us in 2024 - no matter what the year brings.

This year, let's be determined to "trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."

Food Pantry: We continue to be blessed to be able to help people who contact the church office facing food insecurities.


We are collecting the following during the month of January to replenish our stock: peanut butter, jelly, saltines, graham crackers, canned vegetables, and SpaghettiOs.
