Recently, I read an article about a Bible used by British missionaries to minister to enslaved persons in the Caribbean that left me astounded. What struck me most about this Bible is not how it looked or what it said, what gave me pause is what it didn't say. Anthony Schmidt from the Museum of the Bible in Washington, DC estimates that around 90% of the Old Testament and 50% of the New Testament is omitted from the Slave Bible. More pointedly, there are 1,189 chapters in the Bible you and I use regularly, this Bible contains only 232. So, verses such as Galatians 3:28 which states "there is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for you all are all one in Christ Jesus" are omitted while Ephesians 6:5 is included as it calls for servants to be obedient to their masters. Most of the book of Exodus, the story of an enslaved group rising up and leaving behind servitude at the command of God, is left on the cutting room floor.

It occurs to me that this is not a singular occurrence in history. Thomas Jefferson literally cut out all the miracles in the life of Jesus to create what is known as the "Jefferson Bible." What truly troubles me the most though is how we continue to do it, sometimes ignorantly, oftentimes willfully. The question becomes do we realize when we are doing it? Even more critically, do we realize the prejudices that we bring to the Scriptures that blind us to seeing the text in its fullest context? The Scriptures are ultimately, I believe, the most liberating compilation of thoughts the world has ever known. The intent of the Scriptures even at their harshest, for example the Hebrew prophets, is to liberate people from not only sin but abusive societal structures and mindsets as well. When we persist in reading the Scriptures with blinders on we become no better than Jefferson taking a knife and cutting away feeding the 5,000. Sadly, we also tack on another level of chains to enslave us and those who look to us as a faith witness.

One of my goals this year is to allow the Scriptures to truly be alive in my life by seeking to recognize the prejudices I bring to the text and removing my blinders to greater truths. I confess it is not always easy to see the areas where I am blind, but the reward is too great to miss. I pray you will join me in this journey so together our witness would grow brighter and people generations from now will not look back and wonder how did they miss what God was saying? Rather, those generations would rejoice in the steps we took now to bring them freedom then.

So we do not focus on what is seen, but on what is unseen.

For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. (2 Corinthians 4:18, HCSB)

When I look out through my kitchen's bay window, I can see my neighbor's back field, a couple of houses, some trees, and if I look in the right place, Bass Mountain in the distance. If I look out my front window, all I can see is our front yard and hill and part of our neighbors' yards. Because our house is at the bottom of hills in all 4 directions and surrounded by lots of trees, I can't see our road or most of our neighborhood from inside our house; all I can see is what's close to us.

The thing that always amazes me is how different things look through the camera of my drone. When I stand in my front yard and fly the drone up 200-300 feet, through the camera I can see all the way to Burlington. I just have to get my eyes (through the camera) up high, and then I can see for miles.

Our lives are like that. I must admit, I've always been a "here and now" kind of guy. I pay attention to what I see around me. I deal with what's on my mind at the particular moment, and while I may have a general sense of what I want to do long-term, most of my planning is for the short-term. Much like my neighborhood, I only see what's around me at the moment, unless I choose to get my eyes up high.

One of the challenges of the Christian life is to get our eyes in the right place. God is doing so many things in the world around us, and we never see them because we're not looking in the right place. How many opportunities to participate in God's Kingdom work do we miss? How many more people could we reach if we looked to see the eternal things that God is doing around us instead of being focused on just what's around us?

Believe me, I am writing this to myself much more than to you. I am challenging myself - and you - to get our eyes up high, to focus on what is unseen much more than on what is seen.

Let's work on this together, so we can join God in what He is doing.
